## **Cross Country Success**

ISF's Cross Country team delivered exceptional results at the Bavarian International School, securing an overall **2nd place finish**.

- Varsity Girls: With a strong team performance, ISF claimed **2nd place overall**. Anvika Dinesh (6th, 25:13) and Jieun Han (11th, 26:05) stood out with their remarkable times.
- Varsity Boys: Despite competing against older and more experienced athletes, the boys secured 4th place overall. Yudai Harada (8th, 18:48) and Taishi Hattori (11th, 19:22), both Grade 9 students, showed exceptional promise.
- **U14 Girls**: The team claimed **2nd place overall**, led by stellar performances from Michelle Schaffei (4th, 15:57) and Momoka Terada (5th, 16:07). Younger athletes, such as 9-year-old Vera Rey Mazzolari (21st, 18:09), also impressed.
- **U14 Boys**: Finishing **4th overall**, the team demonstrated resilience. Notable efforts included Sarp Kemal Saracoglu (15th, 15:05) and Yumma Haut (17th, 15:20).
- Mixed Relays: ISF closed the day with another 2nd place finish, highlighted by a
  gritty final leg from Saracoglu.

## **Football Highlights**

Football teams faced tough challenges but showed resilience and skill across all categories.

- **U14 Girls**: Competing in Leipzig, the girls' team started strong, winning their pool with victories of 2-0 and 1-1 draws, securing a semifinal spot. Despite injuries that hampered their lineup, they fought hard, finishing **4th overall**.
